Witness under the roof

Rachel Webbley writes:
Alleluia! Christ is Risen!... He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

The joy of Easter is a 'high point' for many of us, bringing a tangible sense of relief after the drama of Holy Week where many of us have the luxury of immersing ourselves in Christ's passion.

In the town, we had further celebrations on St Alphege Day (19th May) as our finance team met and concluded that (including the value of our bespoke Keith Brymer-Jones mugs) we have reached the target for our 'Raise the roof' campaign.

Meeting with our contractors to discuss actual dates and handing over a key for their access helped us to realise it was true - perhaps as the breakfast on the beach

helped the disciples to believe Jesus really is alive!

Yet of course, how quickly life seems to go back to normal. The undertakers call about a tragic death on Easter Monday, deadlines must be met, this year we returned straight back to the school run... The Easter 'high' can be followed, for a time, by a post-Easter 'low'.

The relief of completing part of a big project brings with it tiredness as the adrenalin ebbs away. The 'what next?' question is on the horizon. At these times we turn to prayer and.

in whatever ways we can manage, retreat with God to listen.

Our Week of Accompanied prayer, the Ascension to Pentecost 'Novena', and then our Quiet Day, will I trust, give us space to 'be still and know that I am God.' The rhythm of a healthy Christian journey includes not just rest, but space for God to speak, which rarely happens with an overloaded diary.

The Easter joy is shocking and life-changing, and through God's grace, becomes embedded as a healing and transforming reality. For a time, St Alphege will be encased in scaffolding. It will emerge in September the same but transformed - a new roof to shelter the year-long Easter witness and good news ministry that goes on from under the roof.
